

By the time you read this, the tiny "jewels of flight," the hummingbirds, will have left our area for their trip south. They are just one of God's awe-inspiring creations, able to complete a migration that can be up to 2,000 miles long. Many follow a path along the Gulf of Mexico while others make an incredible 500-mile, nonstop trip across the Gulf. Their tiny wings can flap up to 70 times per second, and their tiny hearts can beat over 1,000 times per minute.

This past summer I was fortunate to have six ruby-throated hummingbirds visit my yard numerous times every day. The facts about them are amazing, but what I love most is the way they hover and 'check things out.' They just seem so curious and brave as they fly very close to get a good look at this big creature (human) in their feeding area. The reason I began with the Bible verse above, however, is because I constantly observed their territorial behavior.

Although it was quite entertaining to watch their aerial acrobatics and hear their tiny voices as they fought to keep each other away from the six feeders and many flowers planted just for them, I couldn't help thinking about human behavior. Our little feathered friends are behaving as God made them to be, but we humans are given free will and the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit to guide our actions and choices. Despite that gift and the abundance of blessings we have been given, we too can be self-centered in our behaviors. We too can waste a lot of time, energy, and good will by being controlling and self-serving. Life is so much better when we live in harmony with one another as Romans 12:16 reminds us to do.

The Bible provides guidance to inspire us as we seek to follow in Jesus' footsteps each day of our lives. Here are a few verses that may speak to you as we move into autumn.

#### GREECE ECUMENICAL FOOD SHELF

October means it is officially fall! The "August Challenge" is successfully behind us, but we thought you all may be interested in what it takes for Lakeview to pull off such an amazing feat and how many people are involved. First of all, each week in July a new clue as to the item we will be collecting is posted at the church. Our secretary, *Dotti*, prints the new flyers that we distribute to neighbors and friends. We start collecting boxes. Our focus item and our goal is announced and food starts pouring in. Every year *Linda Viney* paints our big sign for the front yard. Our neighbors tell us they watch for it every August to see what we are collecting. Items are counted each Sunday to keep track of our progress. Monetary donations need to be turned into actual food by our volunteer shoppers. Many thanks to Linda Viney and Dagmar Doland who relentlessly shopped for hundreds of cans of fruit from many stores in Greece, Spencerport, and Brockport. Some fruit came from as far away as Pennsylvania. On the last Saturday of the month, we hold our drive-up and drop-off for the neighborhood. Thanks to Linda, Dagmar, Gail Wang, Dottie Mason, and Audrey Blocchi for greeting our neighbors and accepting 72 cans of fruit on Aug. 26.

At month's end, the food needs to be loaded on trucks and taken to Maiden Lane for our special delivery appointment. The loading crew consisted of *Dagmar Doland, Linda Viney, Dave Griggs, Sherry Romanczyk, Becky Hibbard, Wayne Hibbard, and Paul Marvin. Paul* and *Wayne* drove their loaded trucks to the GEFS where it was unloaded onto pallets and weighed. Our month-long efforts resulted in **1961 pounds** of fruit!

It takes all these volunteers, PLUS all of YOU, to make the "August Challenge" happen. A HUGE thank you to all the people mentioned above; and most of all, everyone who donated fruit or \$, and took the time and effort to involve others. Lakeview's largest mission project and outreach venture is behind us for another year. *Great job*, *Lakeview!* 

Since hunger never takes a break, we continue to help feed our neighbors in need by donating pasta sauce, canned carrots, and mixed vegetables during October. Thank you all for your continuing generosity. **You rock!**




