# **Stepping Forward with a Positive Attitude**

Recently I had the opportunity to go to the Adirondack Mountains for a day of hiking. The weather was good, and it was the perfect time of year for fall foliage colors. There was a group of us, all in enthusiastic discussion about which mountain to hike, and the comradery couldn't have been better.

As I reflected back on that weekend, how often in our every-day lives do we meet a challenge and then say, "I can't", "it's too hard", and then all the "what ifs." Negative thoughts sometimes prevail in life, and it can become difficult to think positively.

It is normal to have plans and expectations, but one of life's constants can be disappointment. And when we feel this way, we tend to become overwhelmed and discouraged. Unfortunately, the more we dwell on these negative thoughts, the more likely we may be to get lost in them. Often these challenges can seem insurmountable. I think of the challenges of our Savior and his disciples. I think of the challenges of Lakeview Community Church.

The bible has multiple examples of challenges, maintaining a positive attitude, and trusting in the Lord. For example: And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? – *Luke 12:25*. Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance, character, and hope. – *Romans 5:3-4*. Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths. – *Proverbs 3:5-6*. The benefits of a positive attitude changes our perspective in life which, in turn, affects our dispositions and how we treat others, as well as



- 5) Church wintering activities:
- a) six of eight storm windows installed on sanctuary windows (windows 1 & 8 still have screens on to allow opening for fresh air, if needed) DONE:
- b) shut off & drain outdoor water spigots, drain & store both hose reels in garage.
- c) install boundary markers around parking lot for snowplow visual.
- d) station ice melt & snow shovel at church entrances.

The Board Members of the Greece Ecumenical Food Shelf & Clothing Closet Inc. thank the congregation at Lakeview Community Church for your "Canned Fruit Challenge!" I noticed that you were able to collect over 1000 cans of fruit!! We measure in pounds donated, so the total was 1916 pounds of fruit. WOW!

A few more numbers: We served 365 households and 1103 people in August, 2023, compared to 260 households and 745 people in August 2022. 105 more households and 358 more people this August than last year. That is a 49% increase in households served. Serving 365 households and 1103 people is the most we have Served!!! We are very grateful for your continued support to our organization.


